

Effects of Sequestration on Indiana

Defense

- As many as 11,000 civilian workers would be furloughed [[Washington Post, 2/25/13](#)]
- Indiana would see \$133 million economic loss on account of the Army's budget cuts [[Courier-Journal, 2/24/13](#)]
- \$1.4 million reduction in funding for Camp Atterbury [[Palladium- Item, 2/20/13](#)]
- \$36 million reduction in funding for Crane Naval Service Warfare Center- [[Palladium-Item, 2/20/13](#)]

Economic Growth/ Jobs Training

- Would slash Indiana Workforce Development Programs [[National Skills Coalition, February 2013](#)]
 - 28,090 fewer people assisted in job training and education
- Would cut \$870,006 in funding for the Job Corps [[Center for American Progress, 2/22/13](#)]
- Would cut funding for Small Business Administration loan guarantees; \$902 million nation-wide [[White House, 2/08/13](#)]
- Could result in is as much as an 9.4 percent reduction in Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits nation-wide [[White House press release, 2/08/13](#)]

Indiana Education Funding

- \$32.2 million reduction in education funding; 339 education jobs at risk [[Washington Post, 2/25/13](#)]
- 190 teachers and teacher aides could lose their jobs [[Washington Post, 2/25/13](#)]
- Would cut \$6 million in Head Start funding; 1,000 students would lose access [[Washington Post, 2/25/13](#)]

Public Safety/Health

- Indiana could lose \$650,561 in funding for first responders [[CRS, 10/2/12](#); [FEMA](#), SAFER Grants; [FEMA](#), FIRE Grants]
- Would result in fewer nation-wide inspections to prevent foodborne illness [[White House press release, 2/8/13](#); [FSIS, 2/4/13](#)]
- Would reduce overnight shifts at Indiana regional airports [[Courier Journal, 2/24/13](#)]
- Would end Community Development Block Grants nation-wide [[Herald Argus, 2/20/13](#)]
- Reductions to FEMA would reduce grants to Indiana firefighters and first responders [[Center for American Progress, 2/22/13](#)]
- Would cut funding for breast and cervical cancer screenings [[Center for American Progress, 2/22/13](#)]
 - 1,337 fewer screenings in Indiana
- Would cut funding for childhood immunization grants [[Washington Post, 2/25/13](#)]
 - 2,770 fewer children receiving vaccines in Indiana
