### **Federal Agency Websites**



Browse the websites for federal agencies that relate to your area of service (for example, Health and Human Services, Department of Justice, or National Endowment for the Arts). Most have a section entitled Grants/Funding that will describe their grant programs. Overall, there are over 2200 grant programs across 67 federal agencies. ### ***USASpending.gov***

USA Spending was established by the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 to provide the public with information about how their tax dollars are spent. Collecting data about the various types of contracts, grants, loans, and other types of spending in our government will provide a broader picture of the Federal spending processes, and will help to meet the need of greater transparency. The ability to look at contracts, grants, loans, and other types of spending across many agencies, in greater detail, is a key ingredient to building public trust in government and credibility in the professionals who use these agreements.
